**2- Organizational Background**

Egyptian Sudanese organization is a humanitarian voluntary organization provides assistance, education and support for refugees. The organization works with the refugees community in Ezbet El Haggana (kilo 4.5) to promote their educational and vocational skills and to preserve the environment and the local popular traditions and customs.

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:****a) Health care program:**

- This program is being provided in partnership with different health organizations and facilities, by referring the cases that need health care. Also, the organization helps some cases to have free-charge surgery as well as obtaining free medicine.
- The organization holds training courses for women around different themes such as; public health, reproductive health, good nutrition and children feeding and motherhood and childhood health.
- The organization organizes medical campaign within Ezbet El Haggana area.

**b) Child care program: it includes the following:**

- Kindergarten for children from 3 to 6 years old. The children receive meal.
- Organizing trips and animation for children and mothers.

**c) Material and financial assistance:** the organization provides some material

assistance such as food, clothes and covers.

**d) Legal aid program:** in partnership with AMERA

**e) Education service program:**

- Literacy classes for men and women
- English Courses. The organization facilitates the connection among students and the English program at the American University in Cairo.

**f) Vocational program:** organization provides vocational training courses in the field of mechanic and electricity in partnership with professional institutions.

**g) Cultural activities:** organization participates in various public events such as the International Refugee Day.

**4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:**

- The organization targets the refugees from Sudan without discrimination based on religion- sex, political opinions etc...
- The organization focus mainly on the refugee's community who live in Ezbet El Haggana area.

### **2- Organizational Background:**

Student Action for Refugees –STAR- is a student organization at the American University in Cairo, started its work in 2001. It aims at providing the necessary support for refugees' community and raising awareness about refugee issues in Egypt.

### **3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:**

The programs and activities STAR is providing could be described as the following:

- a) Conducting language classes in English and Arabic for refugees.**
- b) Handicrafts program:** this program works to enable refugees to obtain skills and occupations that enhance their economic situation. In addition to organizing temporary exhibitions during the academic year at the university.
- c) Organizing monthly refugee rights-related film.**
- d) Providing technical support for some organization:** that work on refugee issues. STAR provides training for certain organizations about how to set up project to enhance the families' economic situation. Also, STAR assists NGOs to organize bazaar at the university campus.
- e) Organizing World Refugee Day –WRD-:** in 2005 STAR organized WRD which had more than ever before, with over 3.000 people joining in the celebration. Activities included musical performance by groups from Burundi, Sudan, Ethiopia and Palestine and food from many different countries.
- f) Organizing Darfur International Day to raise the awareness about Darfur issues.**

**2- Organizational Background:**

Sadaka was established in 1990 as a non-sectarian, non-political organization, aims at alleviating feelings of misery, despair and depression experienced by the refugee community in Cairo, through listening to refugees speak about their problems with confidential and emotional support.

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:****a) Listening and Counseling Services:**

- 10 trained volunteers provide voluntary listening services on routine basis. 3 volunteers present everyday.
- The volunteers are chosen based on their abilities to listen and their level of commitment. The volunteers are equipped with six-day training course. This course is being provided by professional volunteers, i.e. doctors and psycholo-

gists from Al Nadem Center. The course is being held 2-3 times a year. It is worth to mention that, the volunteers are not trained to dispense advice, they only provide listening and suggest alternatives.

- The volunteers speak with the refugee for an average of an one hour to one hour and half.
- Both male and female volunteers are available. Also, all volunteers are trained to assist children. Usually volunteers can communicate in either Arabic or English. If volunteers available do not speak the refugee's language, will try to arrange for suitable volunteer to be present the next day.

- Al Sadaka provides listening to all refugees without discrimination based on religion, sex, language, ethnic etc..

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:**

The services the consulate is providing could be described as the following:

- Issuing driving license.
- Assisting in renewal of residence permits; for example assist in avoiding additional charges for late renewal.
- Granting marriage's permissions between Palestinian, as well as, between Palestinians and Egyptians.
- Issuing required papers for university admission.
- Issuing variety of official certificates such as; birth certificate, nationality card, certificate proving no criminal record.
- Working with the Embassy of Saudi Arabian to facilitate Hajj.

**2- Organizational Background:**

Coptic Orthodox Cathedral is the first Coptic Church assist refugees, began 13 years ago. The Cathedral Church provides spiritual and material assistances for the refugees from Sudan.

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:**

**a) Financial assistance: it includes the following:**

- Distrusting 40 L.E per person on first Sunday of each month on a regular basis. Money sometimes distributes on Saturday.
- Father Anastasie meets with 25 refugees once or twice a month, to discuss their needs and assists with average of 100 L.E depending on one's problem.

**b) Material assistance:**

the Cathedral distributes clothes for children every Easter and Christmas.

**c) Education:**

limited number of Sudanese sponsored to attend Cathedral's religious training course in order to be employed to assist with spiritual and social services for the refugees.

**d) Job Placement:** Cathedral provides job opportunities for some women.

**e) Spiritual services:**

- Spiritual assembly every Sunday. It provides breakfast and beverages.

- Spiritual assembly for men and youth first Saturday of each month.
- Spiritual assembly for women and children second Saturday of each month

**4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:**

- Cathedral provides its service merely for refugees from Sudan.
- Mostly Christians but some Muslims as well.

**2- Organizational Background:**

ICRC is an independent international humanitarian organization that acts as a neutral intermediary between adversaries in times of war or civil strife. The committee attempts to ensure that conflicts' victims both civilian or military receive protection and assistance.

ICRC Cairo is attempting to particularly promote international humanitarian law both in Egypt and the region as a whole.

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:****ICRC Cairo provides 4 basic services:**

**a) Issuing travel documents:** for the refugees who have been granted the resettlement to another country and do not have a valid passport. In such case the refugee must be referred by either UNHCR or the embassy of the host country.

**The processes:**

- Bring referral letter from UNHCR or the embassy of the host country to ICRC. Often the letter is sent to ICRC by one of these agencies, hence, the refugee should verify which is the case.

- After 3 days, the travel documents is personally delivered. The travel document includes all the information mentioned in the letter of referral form UNHCR or the embassy of the host country.

**b) Issuing letter to Immigration Department:** it follows the Egyptian Ministry of Interior in order to ensure that the refugee is not charged penalty fees for expired passport upon exit. This letter could be obtained by presenting the issued ICRC Travel Document and known date of departure to ICRC.

**c) Transmitting correspondence:** between dispersed family members when normal means of communication are disrupted by violent conflict. When communication is disrupted other than violence, the refugee should contact Egyptian Red Crescent.

Clients should come to ICRC to fill out Red Cross Message form. Only family news is acceptable. The refugee must be able to provide name, date of birth, sex, father's full name, full postal address and telephone number of both sender and addressee. First messages are sent to headquarter in Geneva (19 A venue de la Paix, 1202 Geneva, Switzerland) and distributed from there. It takes an average of 3-4 weeks to reach destination. Replies are always forwarded to HQ in Geneva then either mailed to original sender or the office telephone the sender to pick up the message.

**d) Tracing missing family members:** refugee should come to ICRC to fill out Tracing Request form. The person should be to provide complete information about the full name of person to be traced, as well as, father and mother's names, date of birth, place of birth, sex, nationality origin, profession, marital status, date and kind of last news, last known address, circumstances leading to loss of contact, names and birthdays of those accompanying person to be traced, any additional information that may assist tracing and names of anyone who may be able to assist in the tracing process.

Tracing takes between 3-4 months on average but variable depending on the case. Also, there is a new tool was created to serve the same goal that is : [www.familylinks.icrc.org](http://www.familylinks.icrc.org)

**4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:**

- Eligibility depends on the nature of the service. In order to benefit the services of Issuing Travel Documents or Issuing letter to Immigration Department, refugees

must be recognized by the UNHCR or referred by the host country,  
- However, in order to send Correspondence through ICRC or Trace the whereabouts of a family member, a refugee does not need to be recognized by UNHCR or referred by any other agency. Refugees may arrive independently.

**2- Organizational Background:**

**SUDIA** is International Non-governmental Organization focus on connecting between human, knowledge and available resources to improve life and situation of vulnerable groups in Africa.

In Egypt SUDIA provides social and education services for refugees from African Horn to empower them and increase their self-reliance.

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:**

**a) Refugees' Technology Understanding Program:** this program supports refugees and enable them to use technology of information and help them to find better job opportunities.

- The program includes various training courses such as; basic elements of computer, Internet, PowerPoint, Excel, Access, Database and computer's maintain skills.

- The maximum number of students the course can admit is 8 persons. Individuals who obtain this course can use computers at the organization's headquarter for free.

**b) Education program for Teenagers:** it aims at empowering teenagers with necessary information to protect them from HIV/AIDS and Sexual Transmitted Diseases.

- The program targets teenagers who live in 5 areas; Arba-wa-Nus, 10th District,

Al Mattaria, Ain Shums and Hadaek Al Maadi.

- In the program they train Peers (4 Males and 4 Females) to work in local communities and train teenagers on how to be protected from HIV/AIDs and Sexual Transmitted Diseases.

**c) Summer Education Program for Children:** the program attempts to connect Sudanese children with their home (Sudan). Also, it focuses on rehabilitating children's behaviors and combat violence phenomena among children. And, encourages them to volunteer.

- The program applies innovating methods for education such as Folklore, music, geography. Also, children have the opportunity to learn about their history through art.

**d) Publications and Training Manuals for awareness:** SUDIA publishes various publications and researches to facilitate social work with refugees in Egypt;

- Manual Guide for Socio-psychology care for children who are HIV positive or children whose parents are HIV positive.

- Conducted social research to understand children's vision and point of views about their situation as refugees and their opinions about available services for them.

- Published book titled "My Memories" as guide tool for working with refugee children.

**4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:**

- SUDIA targets refugees who live in Egypt from African Horn.

- Eventually, it targets individuals from Egypt, Cote d'Ivoire and Sierra Leone.

**2- Organizational Background:**

Sudan Sons association is space in where Sudanese from different ethnicity political backgrounds and religions can interact together to innovate. And where, Sudanese culture can actively interact with Egyptian culture.

**3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:****a) Health care program:**

**d) Legal assistance program in partnership with AMERA.****e) Education Program:**

**f) Job Placement program:**

- Association attempts to provide job opportunities for refugees at 6th of October City Factories in partnership with the Coptic Association.
- Association provides training opportunities at 6th of October City Factories, with wages between 10-15 EGP per day. Also, trained individuals could be employed with monthly salary if they wish so.

**g) Cultural activities:**

- Association organizes Puppet Theatre for children.
- It organizes annual culture and innovating festival.
- Association holds cultural and awareness forum each 2 weeks, about themes such as legal, health awareness for women and children.

- Policlinic provides wide array of general and specialized services made possible by over than 85doctors. The available services are differing between general medical, lab, radiology, ante natal, pediatrics, Ultrasound, dentistry, orthopedics and neurology.

- There is no operations available at the clinic. Such cases referred to general hospitals equipped with operation's threats.

- The clinic diagnoses TB but does not provide treat. TB cases referred to special chest hospitals. Also, the clinic does not provide AIDS treatment or drug/alcohol addiction.

- At the end of the course graduates are provided certificates. Many who attend this course emigrated and have found work abroad in the same field due to their certificates and experiences.
