2- Organizational Background:

El Nadim center was established in 1993 to provide medical and psychological rehabilitation for victims of violence and torture.

3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:

a) Treatment and Psychological Rehabilitation Program:

- The center provide management and psychological rehabilitation for the victims of organized violence, torture, rape and any other form of violence.

- Once the patient arrive to the center, general doctor makes comprehensive medical evaluation for the case. Afterward the center provides the necessary either short or long term psychological management according to each case, as the patient will be referred to psychologist and so forth.

- The center refers some cases to CARITAS, whenever the case is eligible to benefit of CARITAS services.

b) Legal aid: the center refers some cases that would need legal assistance to other organizations such as; Hisham Mubarak Center for Law.

c) Medical reports: the center provides detailed medical report to UNHCR. This report considered as document that verify the torture case.

4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:

- The center provides its services for all refugees regardless their nationality, color, religion, their status with UNHCR etc...

5- Conditions to be met by the Beneficiaries:

a) Required Documents: there is no document required

b) Services Fees: patients can receive medical and psychological treatment as well as medications free of charge.

Primarily, through the center's publications and reports.

2- Organizational Background:

The center seeks to use the Egyptian courts to reform the Egyptian laws , in order to consistent with the International Law, and to help victims of violation of human rights.

3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:

- The center provides legal aid for the victims of the violations of human rights.
 - In regard to refugees, previously the center represented the refugees who were in troubles with Egyptian legal authorities. Also, the center assisted refugees with **UNHCR** refugee status determination process, cooperated with **UNHCR** to find refugee children places in Egyptian schools.
 - In some special cases, the center referred refugees to specialized law offices.
- It is important to mention that, the center chooses the cases based on certain criteria such as;
- Cases have potential to reach high constitutional court,
 - Cases involve decisions that may affect many,
 - Cases contain new information that might be used in human rights campaigns in Egypt.

4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups

- The center provides legal assistance for the victims of human rights abuses in

Egypt, including refugees, without discrimination based on color, religion, ethnic etc.... Refugees need not be recognized by UNHCR to receive assistance. However, the center do not serve many refugees.

5- Conditions to be met by the Beneficiaries:

- a) Required Documents:** Individuals should bring with them official documents whenever possible.

2- Organizational Background:

El Khazendara hospital is a government hospital, was established in 1946.

3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:

- It offers outpatient clinic and hospital with all specialties except neuro and orthopedic surgery. Also, the hospital is unable to provide care for Cancer or TB patients.
- Roughly 150 doctors work at the clinic and hospital. The hospital has 143 beds.
- Patients requiring surgery can expect average wait of 2 months depending on the operation type.

4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:

- The hospital provides health care for Egyptians and foreigners, including refugees.

5- Conditions to be met by the Beneficiaries:

a) Required Documents: Refugees should proof that they are residing legally in Egypt i.e. awaiting status determination or official recognized. However, in emergency situation, the hospital will serve anyone in need.

b) Services Fees:

Outpatient clinic's cost divided into 2 categories: first category is free of charge, as patients only pay nominal fee of 1 EGP and receive examination, medicine etc... for free.

Second category; known as "economic department", charges each patient 3 EGP, plus charges extra for examination, investigation, medicine etc... depending on type of services rendered.

The hospital charges for operations, unless patient is unable to pay (i.e. referred by first category of outpatient clinic or arrives in emergency situation), in which case services are provided free of charge.

The hospital was established on 1986

3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:

- The hospital offers all medical services i.e. surgery, pediatrics, internal medicine, ENT, orthopedics, ObGyn etc...
- The hospital refers TB and drug addiction cases to governmental hospitals.
- There is no continuing care, maximum hospital stay of 10 days.

4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:

- The hospital provides health care for Egyptians and foreigners, including refugees.
- Many Somalis live in the area and thus frequent this hospital.

5- Conditions to be met by the Beneficiaries:

a) Required Documents: no documents required in the emergency situations.
But required for expensive surgery.

b) Services Fees:

the fees vary depending upon the service offered:

- Examination for surgery: 10 EGP
- ObGyn examination: 10 EGP

- Internal medicine or pediatrics: 10 EGP

- ENT: 5-10 EGP

- If the patient can not afford the fees, some arrangements can be made. For example, discounted operations available on case-by-case, depending on operation required and financial situation of patient.

- In emergency situations, the hospital will help immediately, but in "cold Case" will usually refer patient to government hospital in order to get service for free

2- Organizational Background:

CCIP has been operated by the Forced Migration and Refugee Studies Program at the American University in Cairo since 2003. CCIP aims at supporting displaced persons and refugees by strengthening refugees' linguistic access to aid, services, rights protection, educational and economic opportunities and community involvement.

3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:

- a) Interpreter Training Course:** CCIP organizes training program to provide the refugees with the translation skills from English to five languages that are: Amharic, Fur, Somali, Arabic and Tigrinya and vice versa. In order to support the organizations that work with the refugees.
- CCIP initiate its call for applications via the website; www.aucegypt.edu/academic/interpreters or within the organizations that are working with the refugees.
 - Candidates must have certain eligibility requirements such as; fluency in English language (spoken and read), good educational background (high school- university level), good oral communications skills and aptitude for learning. The maximum number of students the course can admit is 35.
 - It is a three-month training course. The training runs for 4 days per week. For example, the schedule for the present course is; Saturday, Sunday and Monday

from 6 P.M to 8 P.M. And Tuesday from 6 P.M to 9 P.M, when they invite speaker to discuss one of the human rights issues that concern the students.

- The course includes other training to enhance the refugees' awareness about human rights and accepting the other.

- After the student finishes her/his course successfully, CCIP distributes information about her/him to the entire organizations that are working with the refugees, as well as, to the American, Canadian and Australian Embassies in Cairo.

b) Participatory research: CCIP facilitates the link between scholars and refugee communities to conduct participatory researches about language issues.

4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:

- The project targets all refugees without discrimination based on nationality, color, sex, religion, ethnic etc...

5- Conditions to be met by the Beneficiaries:**a) Required Documents:**

the candidate must fill the application form, Then the project's management will select specific number of eligible applicants.

In the following step, candidates will be required to pass an English and attitudinal test in order to be admitted to the training course. And it is a part of the candidate's interview.

b) Services Fees: if admitted to the course, the candidate will be charged L.E 60 registration fee.

2- Organizational Background:

- It works toward providing Egyptian and refugees children the opportunity to work together in different artistic activities that aim at enhance spirit of accepting the other, teamwork among children. This through different artistic activities such as; drawing, theatre, choir singing groups.

Also, it documents the most pressing problems that face refugees in Egypt. The magazine pays particular attention to the problems and challenges of Ezbet El Haggana community in Cairo.

d) Health Care: foundation provides health care through "Al Shehab Medical Clinic". The clinic provides different cares such as childhood and motherhood. In addition to Laboratory.

e) Vocational Training: foundation provides vocational training program for women to enhance their economic situations. Through, income-generation workshop (sewing) and helping women to find places inside and outside Egypt to market their productions.

f) Building the capacity of Community-based Organizations –CBOs-: foundation provide capacity-building programs for CBOs that are working with refugees. It enable them to use participatory management and implementation tools and Right-based Approach, in addition to other methods that could support CBOs and enhance its capacity to defend the rights of refugees and vulnerable groups.

2- Organizational Background:

Catholic Relief Service works toward promoting social justice through programs aims at alleviating human suffering, promoting human development, solidarity and changing structures that undermine justice and peace.

In regard to refugee program it basically tackles the refugees' priorities and needs. It focuses on education and skills training.

3- Programs and Services Currently Being Provided by the Organization:

a) Education and Adult literacy grant Program: Catholic Relief Services implements UNHCR's education and literacy grant program.

- Upon receiving UNCR annual grant money, the organization advertises availability of funding through schools, churches and various NGOs.
- Prospective individuals are asked to apply for funding, demonstrating both official UNHCR refugee status and prior enrolment in education institutions.
- Catholic Relief Organization then distributes funding at St. Andrews Church to children and adults already enrolled in;
- One of six refugee schools: All Saints Cathedral, St. Luangwa, St. Bekita, St. Josephs, African Hope, Displaced Sudanese Learning Center and Arba-wa-nus Central. In addition to 70 private and government run schools.
- One of 5 Literacy centers: 4 are run by St. Andrews and 2 in Arba-wu-nus.
- In terms of education grants, individual generally receives 600 EGP per year. Children who are enrolled in refugee schools receive 400 EGP directly and 200 EGP per child is given to refugee school itself.

b) Private program: since 2000, Catholic Relief Organizations work in partnership with other NGOs and churches to provide services for refugees, such as;

- Funding vocational training program offered by Sakakini Sacred Heart Church.
- Funding summer program offered by Don Bosco in Maadi (church-affiliated group working with Sakakini).
- Donating medical equipments to All Saints Church.
- Donor to St. Andrews Church.

4- Ultimate Beneficiaries and Targeted Groups:

- The education and adult literacy grant program is limited for refugees who are officially recognized by UNHCR.
- Refugees who are not recognized by UNHCR could benefit the private program- the organization implements in partnership with other churches and NGOs

a) Required Documents: prospective refugees who apply for education grant have to submit official UNHCR status.
